

CORNLAND BANK **ROBBED APRIL 1958**

(March 6, 1958)

The Village of Cornland, 10 miles southwest of Mt. Pulaski,, was thrown into a turmoil Tuesday, when two armed men robbed the bank there, of some \$1300 about noon.

This was the second bank robbery in Logan county in the past six months, but unlike the previous one at Chestnut, the robbers played rather rough with bank employees. George Drake, cashier, and Miss Minnie Bryson, bookkeeper, both slugged by the robbers, were tied up and adhesive tape applied.


