CORNLAND BANK ROBBED APRIL 1958

(March 6, 1958)

The Village of Cornland, 10 miles southwest of Mt. Pulaski, was thrown into a turmoil Tuesday, when two armed men robbed the bank there, of some \$1300 about noon.

This was the second bank robbery in Logan county in the past six months, but unlike the previous one at Chestnut, the robbers played rather rough with bank employees. George Drake, cashier, and Miss Minnie Bryson, bookkeeper, both slugged by the robbers, were tied up and adhesive tape applied.

During the years of the 1870's, 1880's and 1890's, and perhaps before, there lived in Mount Pulaski a well-known married couple, considered then as old settlers. Their home was located on North Washington St., south of the library building, on what was known as the Muldoon property.

This couple was known as Uncle Cush Stafford and Aunt Kitty Stafford, and this picture shows them sitting out in the

yard sometime in the 1870's, enjoying their clay pipes. Mr. Stafford, whose full name was Oliver Cushman Stafford, was a widely known dealer in horses. Mrs. Stafford was the former Kitty Baker of Christian and Sangamon counties. She was the sister of Col. William Baker of Taylorville, who came to Mount Pulaski on the occasion of many meetings of the Logan County Old Settlers Association, and always made a talk on pioneer days.

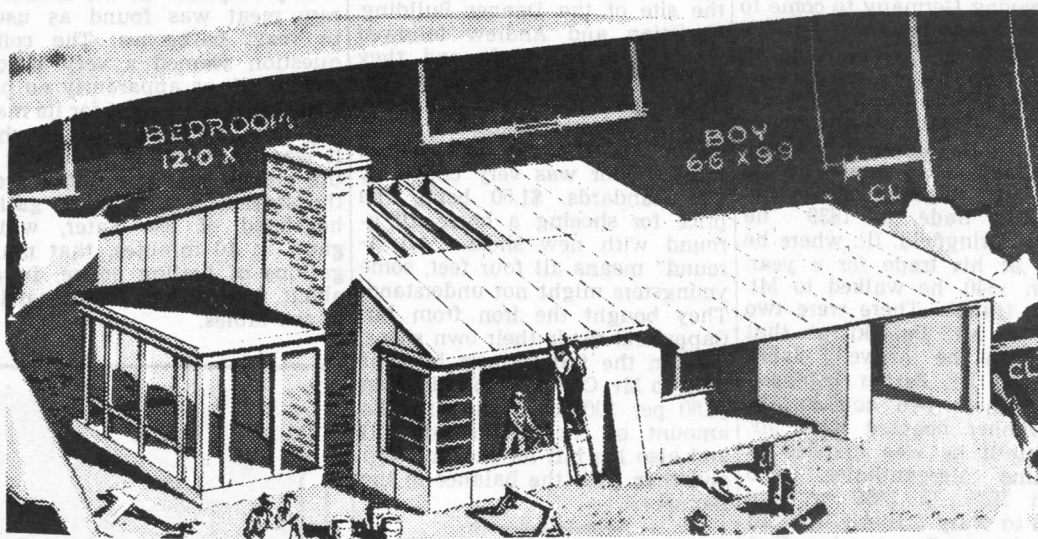
